



Thailand, Cambodia and Vietnam

13 Night Private Tour

Explore the wonders of Southeast Asia with a journey through Thailand, Cambodia, and Vietnam, offering a perfect mix of culture, history, and unforgettable adventures.

Begin in Bangkok, where you'll visit the majestic Grand Palace and the Reclining Buddha. In Cambodia, engage with the Kok Sangke community and marvel at the awe-inspiring Angkor Wat, followed by a magical Apsara dance show. Discover the grandeur of Cambodia's Royal Palace before a fast boat ride along the Mekong River to Vietnam. Experience the lively floating markets and explore the historic Cu Chi Tunnels.

Highlights:

- Discover Bangkok's majestic Grand Palace and the enormous Reclining Buddha
- Spend time with the Kok Sangke community in Cambodia
- Discover the timeless beauty of Angkor Wat
- Enjoy a dinner accompanied by an enchanting Apsara dance show.

- Fast boat journey along the Mekong River from Cambodia to Vietnam

What's included:

- Getting there: Return flights to Bangkok

- Meals included: 12 breakfasts, 4 lunches and 2 special dinners (dinner with Aspara dance show, and dinner on La Perle D'Orient on the Saigon river)

Full Itinerary

Day 1 - Overnight Flight

Board your overnight flight from the UK to Bangkok Airport BKK.

Day 2 - Arrival In Bangkok

Arrive in Bangkok, meet local tour guide and transfer to your hotel. Spend your afternoon relaxing and enjoying the hotel's facilities, or head out to begin exploring the city.

Day 3 - Bangkok City Tour

Immerse yourself in Thai culture today, on a full-day sightseeing tour.

Your first stop will be the colourful floating markets at Damnoen Saduak. Watch as the locals buy fresh produce from the traders on the boats, then head back into Bangkok for a guided tour.

See the Royal Island, where the Grand Palace adjoins the Wat Phra Kaew temple with its Emerald Buddha, as well as the less formal Wat Pho temple, home to the gigantic Reclining Buddha.

Day 4 - Bangkok to Cambodia

After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your included flight to Siem Reap.

On arrival, be met by your guide and transfer to your hotel, with the rest of the afternoon at your leisure.

Day 5 - Visit the Kok Sangke Community

Today, you'll be driven to the Kok Sangke community to visit the home of a local family who'll make you several traditional Khmer desserts. You'll then learn about the village's sustainable farming techniques, visit a community center, which teaches local farmers about eco-friendly farming methods, see some nearby farms, and have lunch before travelling to Wat Luang Proleung and the village of Kampong Khleang.

Day 6 - Visit the Angkor Temples

Today you will discover the four vast stone heads and countless carved faces of the Bayon, which stands in the heart of the 'lost city' of Angkor Thom.

Angkor Thom was the greatest citadel of the Khmer Empire that ruled half of South East Asia for nearly 600 years, and its ruined boulevards and gateways cover a vast area to the north of Siem Reap. Yet it is not the highlight of this landscape littered with great ruins, that title goes to Angkor Wat. The world's largest religious building, with its five great towers and 1000-metre-long carved bas-relief, is dazzling and unforgettable. Expect to return to your hotel awed and amazed by everything you've seen.

Enjoy dinner with Apsara dance show at Kanell restaurant.

Day 7 - Siem Reap to Phnom Penh

After breakfast, begin your journey to Phnom Penh. As this is a fairly long overland drive, it is recommended to make the most of the day with a stop halfway at the archaeological site of Sambor Prei Kuk. Explore this lesser-visited UNESCO World Heritage Site, dating back to the 7th century and the pre-Angkorian Chenla Kingdom, and enjoy a slice of local life with lunch at a community-run local food shop.

You may choose to explore the site by bicycle, a relaxed and enjoyable way to travel at the country's pace while venturing onto smaller trails. In the afternoon, continue the drive, arriving in Phnom Penh in the late afternoon.

Check in to your hotel, with the remainder of the day free to relax.

Day 8 - Phnom Penh Walking Tour with Street Food

Sitting at the confluence of the Tonle Sap and Mekong rivers, Phnom Penh is a city rich in diverse heritage. This morning's tour, extending into the early afternoon, takes you on a walking and tuk-tuk adventure to uncover some of the city's most iconic architecture alongside its finest street food.

Skip breakfast at the hotel and meet your guide at 7.30am. The day begins with a tuk-tuk ride to Psar Kandal Market, offering a first taste of local life and a wide choice of breakfast options. Your guide may recommend the popular mu char fried noodles, although you are free to choose whatever appeals on the day.

From the market, you set off on a riverside walk, passing several striking colonial-era buildings and gaining insight into the city's evolution over the years, beginning with the Post Office, built in the 1890s. You then pass the National Library and the Raffles Hotel Le Royal, both constructed in the 1920s in distinctly different architectural styles.

The walk continues towards Cambodia's largest market, Psar Thmey, an impressive Art Deco landmark designed in 1937 by French architect Louis Chauchon. Beneath its vast yellow dome, four wings bustle with stalls selling everything from silver jewellery to fresh seafood. While here, you may also choose to visit a traditional Cambodian fortune teller and have your fortune told (optional and at additional cost).

During the tour, you may also stop to visit the magnificent Royal Palace and its Silver Pagoda, home to a remarkable collection of priceless Buddhist artefacts. Afterwards, enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure.

Day 9 - Phnom Penh to Chau Doc

Spend a thought-provoking morning at the Tuol Sleng Museum, which chronicles the Pol Pot years and the reign of the Khmer Rouge.

Afterwards, you'll have the opportunity to visit the Wat Phnom Temple before you board the fast boat along the Mekong River to feel the wind on your face on a thrilling boat ride into Vietnam.

Day 10 - Chau Doc to Can Tho

Your day begins with a visit to the holy mountain of Nui Sam. Studded with pagodas and temples, the mountain offers visitors stunning views over the Mekong Delta, which awaits you today.

You'll stay overnight in the university town of Can Tho, with its colourful floating markets, busy working harbour and sacred Khmer pagoda, Muniwangsyaram.

MEALS INCLUDED: Breakfast

Day 11 - Can Tho to Ho Chi Minh

Enjoy another journey through the Mekong landscape of rice paddies, flat-bottomed boats, fruit trees and bougainvillea, peopled by farmers in conical hats and dotted with floating markets. Take a fascinating boat ride to the floating markets of Cai Rang, before arriving in Ho Chi Minh City.

In the afternoon, a guided tour will reveal its fascinating mix of French colonial history and modern Vietnamese life. Highlights include the grand General Post Office, the Reunification Hall on the site of the former President's Palace, the Xa Loi Pagoda with its bronze Buddha, and (time permitting) the War Remnants Museum.

Your day ends with dinner at La Perle D'Orient cruise along Saigon river.

Day 12 - Cu Chi Tunnels and travel to Bangkok

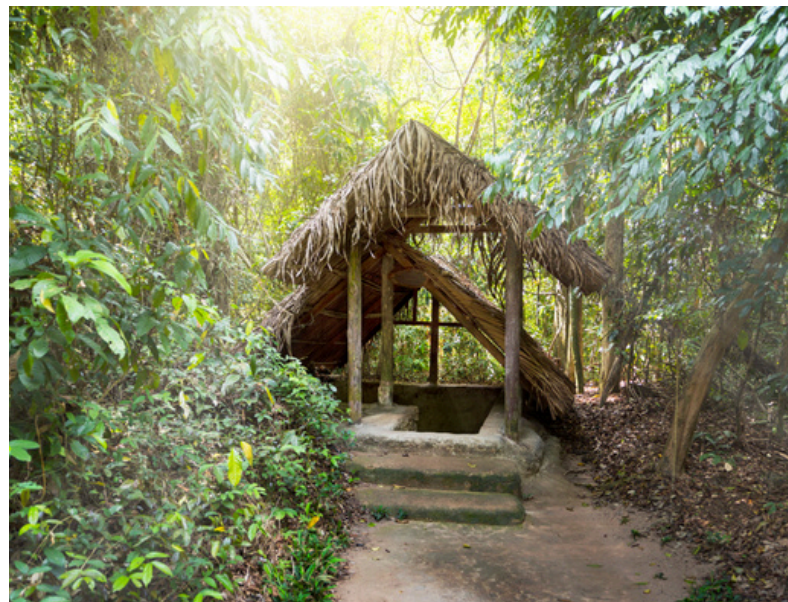
The remarkable Cu Chi tunnel complex provides a poignant reminder of the country's recent history. This 200 km underground labyrinth was used by the Viet Cong as a base, and now serves as a national memorial for those who lost their lives in the conflict.

In the afternoon, proceed to the airport for your flight to Bangkok.

Arrive in Bangkok, meet local tour guide and transfer to your hotel. Spend your afternoon relaxing and enjoying the hotel's facilities.

FAQs

WHEN IS THE BEST TIME TO TRAVEL?

The best time to visit South-East Asia is November to April when it's dry and warm. Wet season and monsoonal rains fall from June to October.

During Vietnamese Lunar New Year, most restaurants and attractions are closed, therefore we recommend not to travel during this time.

MALARIA

It is not common to get malaria, unless you are staying in the mountains or the jungle for a long time.

DRESS CODES FOR SOME HISTORICAL SITES

Be mindful of local customs and wear suitable attire when visiting religious or cultural sites. This typically involves covering your shoulders and knees. Dress code guidelines are often displayed at the entrance to these places.

WHAT LUGGAGE IS INCLUDED ON MY INTERNAL FLIGHT?

The internal flight with Vietnam Airlines includes 23kg check-in luggage and 12kg cabin baggage per person.

WHO IS THIS TOUR SUITABLE FOR?

This tour is accessible to most people with an average level of fitness and normal mobility. This tour is not suitable for anyone with walking difficulties. Children aged 6 and above.

VISAS AND VACCINATIONS

UK passport holders can enter Thailand visa-free for a stay up to 60 days, and Vietnam visa-free for a stay up to 45 days.

UK passport holders require a visa to enter Cambodia, you can apply for an E-Visa, or get a visa on arrival. A visa on arrival costs \$30 USD per person in cash on arrival at the border, and your passport needs to have at least one completely blank page and be valid for more than 6 months. From 1 September 2024, you will also need to complete and submit an e-Arrival card within 7 days prior to arrival into Cambodia, there is no charge for this.
